Surrounded by rocking chairs, plantings, stonework, and water, the tree establishes a comforting place for conversation, reflection, and everyday life.

CREATING A NEIGHBORHOOD INDOORS

A monumental tree becomes the center of an indoor streetscape designed around gathering, recognition, and everyday connection.

A procession of Oak Trees follows the movement of the corridor, creating a natural rhythm through the interior.
